

Whilst driving round Amarillo one evening I was reminded of this. After passing a number of standard road signs, "Give Way," "4-way Stop,"
"Pavement Ends," "Don't Mess With Texas," I was no more surprised to see

a sign displaying the phrase "We Have Our Secrets." Sure we do. We all do. And did that sign divert me from the job in hand - driving? Well, no.

British artist Michael Pinsky was this week criticized for an art installation that appeared on a round-about (traffic circle) in a busy town center in England. It consisted of a group of 10 regular road signs that were grouped together, all contradicting each other. Apparently confused motorists had no less than a dozen accidents this month as a result of the "sculpture," and it has since been moved to a safer place.

A spokesman for the British Automobile Association reportedly said, "Anything that diverts motorists' attention from the road is not helpful ... Maybe art should be left to the art galleries and not our road network."
